What do we do in our sessions?

- ★ Developmentally appropriate music & movement activities to themed music
- ★ Play a variety of percussion instruments

- ★ Basic music concepts such as rhythm and pitch
- ★ Nature inspired songs & rhymes
- ★ Indigenous appreciation and references to Country
- ★ Exploring different languages and cultures
- ★ Safe, inclusive, relaxed & fun environment
- ★ Opportunities for each child to have creative input
- ★ Bonding for you and your little one, and connecting with community

How much does it cost?

We encourage centres to charge \$12-\$15 per child per session. Each session runs for 30-40 minutes depending on age group. Minimum fee for a visit from Jemma is typically \$130, depending on your budget and specific requirements.

Music is so much fun! But how does it support early childhood development?



Fine motor skills & coordination

Playing instruments involves body coordination, listening to others to create a unified sound, and the fine motor skills needed to grasp clap sticks or wiggle the fingers in finger-play nursery rhymes.

Language development

Did you know that playing music uses the same parts of the brain involved in learning language? Singing, embracing new melodies, and learning instruments strengthens pathways in the brain for sound processing and comprehension, and we are always learning new words and letters in our songs.

Introducing basic mathematics

Playing with simple rhythms, and counting and drawing beats on a whiteboard introduces children to pattern recognition, simple addition, as well as the fundamental basics of music notation.

Listening and teamwork

Music has always been a significant part of human culture. It is a way of bringing the community together, sharing stories and bonding with others. Playing and singing as an ensemble creates a powerful sense of unity, and encourages cooperation and shared expression in a playful and loving environment.

Self confidence & self esteem

Practicing an instrument and seeing yourself improve with practice is wonderfully rewarding, and teaches the value of perseverance. Jamming with Jemma classes also provide opportunities for children to practice their skills in front of others, where they are always met with lots of applause and warm encouragement.
